DepEd MEMORANDUM No. **074** , s. 2020

SECOND NATIONAL SUMMIT ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD IN EDUCATION

To: Undersecretaries Assistant Secretaries Minister, Basic, Higher, and Technical Education, BARMM Regional Directors Schools Division Superintendents All Others Concerned

1. The Department of Education (DepEd), through the Office of the Undersecretary for Legal Affairs (OULA), will conduct the **Second National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education** with the theme, *Isulong! Karapatan ng Bawat Bata sa Edukasyon sa Panahon ng COVID-19*, on November 23–24, 2020, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., via the Zoom online platform.

2. The Summit is scheduled in November as part of the annual celebration of the National Children's Month mandated by Republic Act No. 10661, otherwise known as the *National Children's Month Act*, to commemorate the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) by the United Nations (UN) General Assembly on November 20, 1989, and instill its significance in the Filipino consciousness. Dr. Philip D. Jaffé, Director of the Center for Children's Rights Studies at the University of Geneva, will deliver a lecture on the role of child rights in the time of the COVID-19 pandemic. Dr. Jaffé is a distinguished member of the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child, the body created by the CRC to facilitate the fulfillment of children's rights, which is based in Geneva, Switzerland. Dr. Robert Jenkins, Global Chief of Education and Associate Director of the UNICEF Headquarters in New York, USA, will also deliver a lecture on the effects of COVID-19 on children's education around the world and the responses of various countries.

3. The COVID-19 pandemic has challenged all sectors of society to become creative, resourceful, and vigilant. For this Department, the challenge was to deliver or supervise quality and rights-based education (RBE) to more than 24 million learners despite the pandemic. In response to the challenges brought by the COVID-19 pandemic, this Department issued DepEd Order No. 012, s. 2020, or the Adoption of the Basic Education-Learning Continuity Plan for School Year 2020-2021 in Light of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.¹

4. The main objective of the Basic Education-Learning Continuity Plan (BE-LCP) is to ensure learning continuity through the K to12 curriculum, while protecting the health, safety, and well-being of learners, teachers and personnel, and prevent further transmission of COVID-19.² To this end, the BE-LCP implements different learning delivery modalities (LDM) aside from limited face-to-face learning, such as distance learning (modular learning, online learning, TV/radio-based instruction, or blended learning), and homeschooling. Moreover, the K to12 curriculum was streamlined into the Most Essential Learning Competencies, where the total number of competencies in all

learning areas from Kindergarten to Grade 12 was reduced by 60% from 14,171 to $5,869.^{\scriptscriptstyle 3}$

5. Amidst all these adjustments, child rights in education and the delivery of rightsbased education (RBE) remain a top priority for this Department. The BE-LCP explicitly states that in addressing the COVID-19 situation, existing laws and rules may be used with the end view of upholding the constitutional and international rights to education and health, and promoting the best interest of the child.⁴ To achieve that, synergy with other government agencies, international organizations, NGOs, the academe, and other child rights stakeholders will be crucial to the respect, protection, and promotion of the various rights of the child in the particular context of the COVID-19 emergency.⁵ A wholeof-government, and even a whole-of-society approach, are needed to ensure that children's rights in education are upheld during these trying times.

6. The National Children's Month is a celebration of the rights of all children in the Philippines. For this Department, it celebrates the rights of all children in the context of education, as well as the efforts of the Department and its partners in government, civil society, and the academe to uphold these rights of children through the BE-LCP and other programs, projects, and activities.

7. As provided in DepEd Memorandum No. 068, s. 2020,⁶ the Summit is a highlight activity of this Department during the 2020 National Children's Month. The Summit aims to

- a. build on the insights, commitments, and recommendations of the First National Summit on the Rights of the Child in Education held in November 2019;
- b. reinforce the continuing commitment of the Philippine government, including DepEd, and other stakeholders in upholding children's rights, particularly RBE in normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic;
- c. facilitate discussions and elicit recommendation on upholding RBE in normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic through a whole-of-DepEd, whole-of-government, and whole-of-society approach; and
- d. ensure the participation of children in shaping policies and actions pertaining to RBE in normal times and during the COVID-19 pandemic.

8. Participants in this activity are officials and personnel of public and private basic education schools and the central, regional, and schools division offices. There will also be representatives from other government agencies, civil society, and international and private organizations. Most importantly, the Summit will be attended by children themselves as an exercise of the rights of children to participate in matters that concern them. Parents, guardians, and caregivers are also invited to attend the Summit, highlighting their pronounced role as partners in their children's education during the COVID-19 pandemic.

9. There will also be a **Pre-Conference Session with Children** on **November 16**, **2020**, **from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.** to further realize the rights of children to participation. This session aims to orient the children participants on RBE and their rights to participation, as well as serve as a venue for them to share their insights and ideas on the different topics to be discussed during the Summit.
